## FILM DESCRIPTION

1.

Our short film "Precious" is the result of collaborative work between master students of social and cultural anthropology and Nigerian students who fled the war in Ukraine within a seminar of Visual Anthropology at the FU Berlin.

The ethnographic film is about Precious, a young Nigerian woman who has just arrived in Berlin after fleeing from Kiev, and the way Precious herself crafts her definition of home in the new city. With this film we want to show how a crisis situation, such as the current war in Ukraine, can also lead to new

opportunities. In the film Precious deals with important issues such as racism and trauma, but also dreams, friendships and the definition of a place to call "home".

The collaborative nature of the project is of particular importance for us. We consider the reflection about our positionalities and the topic of agency central to our work. All four of us were involved in every step of the creation of the artistic product, from the choice of theme, to how and where to film, to editing, and above all we tried to follow and listen as much as possible to the needs of the protagonist. This process of creating a collaborative ethnographic film as well as building trust and sincere relationship to each other is also what we tried to transparently present in the film.

## 2.

Our film is the result of collaborative work within a seminar on Visual Anthropology entitled 'Kollaboratives Filmprojekt mit geflüchteten Frauen in Berlin' at the Freie Universität Berlin. Thanks to the seminar's lecturers and Tubman Network e.V. - Coalition of Black Organisations in Germany & Allies' students from the second semester of the master's programme in Social and Cultural Anthropology and African students who had to flee the Ukraine met to work together on the films.

In the course of four intensive months of cooperation between three students (Martina, Theresa, Zofia) and Precious, the protagonist and now also a student of social sciences, a short film was created portraying a person at a crucial moment of change beyond her control. a situation in which a crisis, a catastrophe can lead to the opening up of new possibilities, opportunities.

The film explores how Precious crafts her new life in Berlin. Originally from Nigeria, Precious was about to start her studies in Kiev, which she had to leave all of a sudden due to the war in Ukraine.

The film is scrambled with questions such as: Why can't she go back to Nigeria? Why is she here? Her experience with racism, her life in Berlin, her plans and dreams for the future.

The collaborative nature of the project was particularly important to us. We considered our positionalities, how we should work together, and the topic of agency. As we are three visual ethnographers working with Precious, we considered how we should divide our 'focus' responsibilities, such as interviewing/observing/filming, but without losing the sense that we are all ethnographically involved. This process of creating a collaborative anthropological film as well as building our personal, friend-, relationship is also what we try to transparently present in the film.
