

Saw Kill Watershed Community Internship:

The ideal candidate for this internship is someone who is interested in engaging with both the Bard and the local community. As a SKWC intern, you will work closely with community members, Bard faculty, staff, and students. The Saw Kill Watershed Community is a group dedicated to protecting and preserving the Saw Kill watershed through science, education and outreach. As an intern, you will help with the group's monitoring program, community meetings, and outreach/education events. This involves working with the Bard Water Lab. Due to the self-directed nature of the internship, you must be comfortable working independently. People skills and an interest in bettering communication skills are a must.

Monitoring program: Every month, teams of samplers go out to sample at 14 different locations along the Saw Kill. They collect water, record temperature, conductivity, and physical observations. These are taken back to the Bard Water Lab where volunteers help to process the samples. As the SKWC intern - you are responsible for recruiting new volunteers and training samplers.

Community Meetings: SKWC has monthly meetings to engage with the community and discuss issues concerning the Saw Kill. Interns are responsible for helping to set-up/clean up
