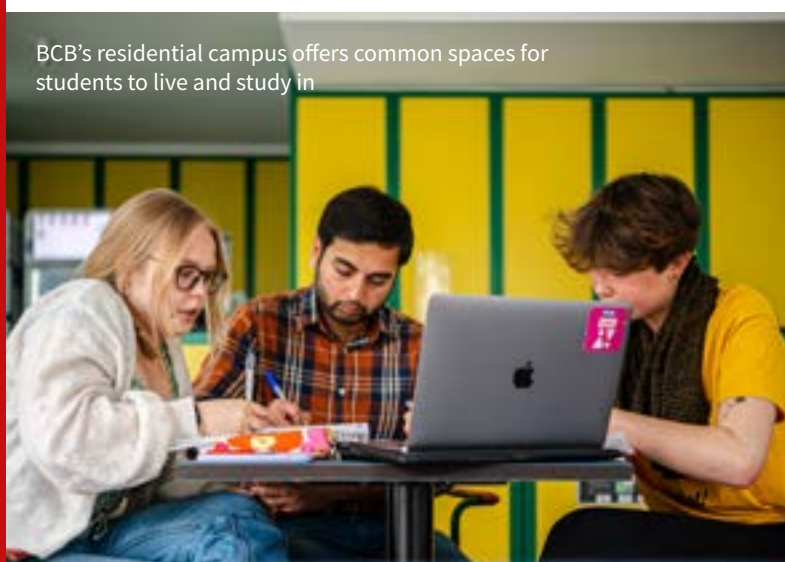

BA PROGRAM

At Bard College Berlin, students from over sixty countries across six continents acquire the fundamental disciplinary and historical knowledge needed to address twenty-first century challenges and opportunities, and master a specialization in economics, politics, literature, or the arts.

CORE CURRICULUM

A series of interdisciplinary courses taken over six semesters covering the history of ideas and society from ancient Greece to the present, including a focus on the major developments in philosophy, literature, art, social theory, science, and religion.

BA PROGRAM

A liberal arts education offers students both **breadth** and **depth of learning**. The Bachelor of Arts program at Bard College Berlin combines interdisciplinary study across the humanities, social sciences, and history of science with specialization in a chosen academic field. A flexible course selection allows students to explore different areas of study according to their interests and across academic boundaries, while the progression of the program towards independent research in the fourth year allows students to gain expertise in one discipline.

Exposure to new fields, thinking across academic disciplines

The **core curriculum** and **electives** are the main sources of breadth in the BCB program. Throughout their studies, all BA students follow a common curriculum in intellectual, cultural, and political history. Electives allow students to explore new areas of study and enrich their major with a variety of academic and artistic experiences. All students have an academic advisor, who helps them build a tailored and cohesive selection of courses over four years.

Developing expertise in an individual area of study

The main sources of depth in the BA program are the selection of a **major** and the **senior thesis**. Students declare their major in the fourth semester after completing foundational courses in one or several areas of interest. The BA program then progresses towards independent research closely supervised by a faculty member and guided by participation in a **research colloquium**.

Practical experience and professional skills

All degree-seeking students **learn German** to at least an **intermediate level** during their studies. This enables them to intern in Berlin, work off-campus, and access the German and European job markets and graduate programs after graduation. Additionally, the **internship course** allows students to gain work experience in fields related to their studies. The BA program prepares students for graduate study and careers in the public, private, and nonprofit sectors, in domains such as international relations, public policy, journalism, and the arts.

CIVIC ENGAGEMENT

Bard College Berlin supports student involvement with public life outside the classroom to promote commitment to active citizenship, and contribute to an engaged university. Through student-led projects, volunteer work, skill development workshops, or engagement fellowships, BCB students actively work for positive social change in local communities or engage with relevant global questions. Students cooperate across the Open Society University Network (OSUN) by participating in international conferences and training sessions, sharing resources, or leading projects that span several campuses around the globe.

- Recent projects include:
- **BCB Goes Green:** promoting sustainable and environmentally-friendly practices and policies on campus
 - **BCB Swap Shop:** sustainability project promoting the exchange of clothing and various reusable items
 - **BCB Urban Gardening:** growing and harvesting vegetables and herbs for sustainability, and developing green spaces on campus
 - **BCB Volunteer Action Days:** student involvement in social activities and humanitarian causes in the city of Berlin
 - **The English Hour:** student-led community program bringing together the neighborhood and the BCB community for conversational English classes and inter-cultural exchange
 - **International Weeks Against Racism:** raising awareness of racial discrimination and issues through campus-wide and local events organized by BCB's Civic Engagement and DEI Offices
 - **Involved Campus Talks:** creating a space for sharing thoughts, experiences, ideas, and suggestions on a topic of collective and personal importance

INTERNSHIPS

Students can complete an internship in Berlin with a local organization in fields such as film/TV/radio, human rights, publishing, or public policy as well as with individual artists and galleries. BCB's Career Development Office has established extensive connections with internship hosts in Berlin over the years, assisting students in finding an internship placement that matches their qualifications and interests. The practical internship experience is guided by the Internship Seminar, an academic course exploring contemporary ways of working in relation to the students' own internship experience. BCB students have had internship placements at Humanity in Action, an international nonprofit organization; The Reader, an independent organization for creative writing workshops and literature; Plan A, a Berlin start-up business that works toward reducing CO₂ emissions; the curatorial department of Hamburger Bahnhof, one of the largest collections of contemporary art in Berlin; and others. In addition, the Bard Globalization and International Affairs program offers students the opportunity to intern in New York City while taking evening classes.

CERTIFICATES

In addition to their four-year BA degree, students at Bard College Berlin can obtain certificates to complement their studies and gain knowledge and skills in an interdisciplinary field. Currently, the College offers the following certificates: **Civic Engagement Certificate** and **Certificate in Transnational Media and Journalism**.

- The Certificates consist of three components:
- 4 or 5 courses cross-listed as certificate courses (4 US / 8 ECTS credits each)
 - Co-curricular activities amounting to 100 hours of practical experience
 - Culminating project (analytic essay, publication, podcast, or art project)

In the **Certificate in Civic Engagement**, students learn about theories of citizenship, democratic participation, civil society, and social action, and develop firsthand experiences with civic engagement through co-curricular activities outside of the classroom setting.

The **Transnational Media and Journalism Certificate** combines studies of the content, history, and impact of various media and technologies with practical training and co-curricular activities. Students get involved in journalistic and media initiatives that are currently shaping the public sphere in Berlin, Germany, and the world.

ACCOMMODATION

All first- and second-year BA students, as well as Academy Year students, live on campus in apartment-style residence halls, in shared or single rooms. The residence halls are spacious, light-filled buildings, each no more than a 5-minute walk from the teaching buildings.

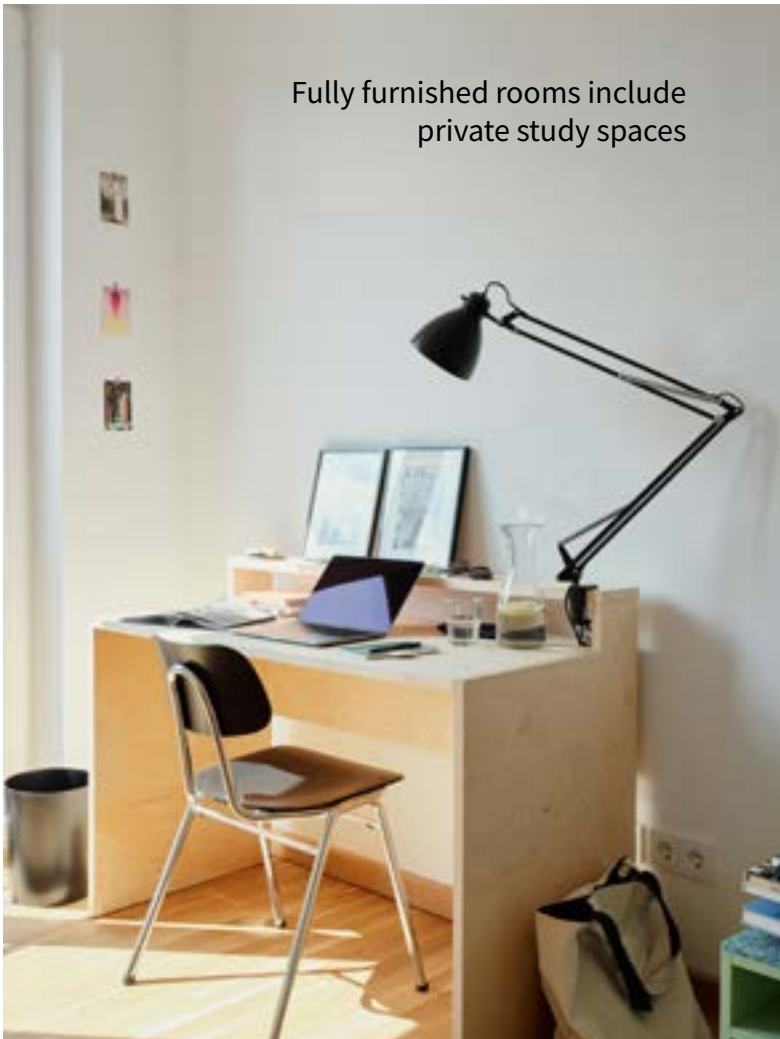
The Residential Life staff support students in providing an active community in BCB's highly international residence halls.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Bard College Berlin encourages excellent candidates to apply for a scholarship to support their participation in the BA degree programs in Economics, Politics, and Social Thought or Humanities, the Arts, and Social Thought.

All scholarships are awarded on the basis of academic excellence, in addition to the criteria listed for the individual scholarships.

Scholarship in Aesthetics

Who: Students who apply for admission to the BA in Humanities, the Arts, and Social Thought and demonstrate an exceptional record of academic and extracurricular interest in visual arts, theater arts, or art history.

Award: 10,000 EUR grant; renewable for four years. Competitive scholarship with the option to increase upon demonstration of financial need.

Scholarship in Literary Arts

Who: Students who apply for admission to the BA in Humanities, the Arts, and Social Thought and demonstrate an exceptional record of academic and extracurricular interest in literature and creative or academic writing.

Award: 10,000 EUR grant; renewable for four years. Competitive scholarship with the option to increase upon demonstration of financial need.

Scholarship in Philosophy, Politics, and Economics

Who: Students who apply for BA admission, and demonstrate an exceptional record of academic and extracurricular interest in politics, philosophy, and/or economics.

Award: 10,000 EUR grant; renewable for four years. Competitive scholarship with the option to increase upon demonstration of financial need.

AP Capstone Scholarship

Who: Students who apply for BA admission and will successfully complete the AP Capstone diploma program by August 2023.

Award: Financial need-based award; renewable for four years.

Berlin Scholarship

Who: Students who apply for BA admission and have demonstrated a sustained interest in German language and culture by taking German courses in high school.

Award: Financial need-based award; renewable for four years.

Program for International Education and Social Change Scholarship

Who: Students from areas of crisis and conflict who demonstrate academic excellence and a deep commitment to social change, democracy, and human rights.

Award: Up to the full on-campus comprehensive fee and additional stipend for living expenses; awarded for up to 4 years of the BA degree.

First Generation Scholarship

Who: Students applying for BA admission and are the first in their family to attend university.

Award: Up to the full on-campus comprehensive fee, depending on financial need; renewable for four years.

Global Fellow Scholarship

Who: Students who apply for BA admission and intend to study at multiple Bard campuses during their degree.

Award: Financial need-based award; renewable for four years.

Global Citizen Scholarship

Who: Students applying for BA admission who have studied or worked abroad for at least 6 months during or after high school.

Award: 10,000 EUR grant; renewable for four years. Competitive scholarship.

Open Europe Scholarship

Who: Students who apply for BA admission, are citizens of an EU member state or a recognized candidate country (Albania, Republic of North Macedonia, Moldova, Montenegro, Serbia, Turkey, Ukraine), and demonstrate an interest in living in an international community.

Award: Up to the full on-campus comprehensive fee, depending on financial need; renewable for four years.

The United World Colleges Scholarship

Who: Graduates or graduating students of one of the 18 United World Colleges worldwide who apply for BA admission and demonstrate an exceptional record of civic engagement.

Award: Up to the full on-campus comprehensive fee, depending on financial need; renewable for up to four years.

Voluntary Engagement Scholarship

Who: Students applying for BA admission who have successfully completed a recognized voluntary service program (Freiwilliges Soziales Jahr, European Voluntary Service, etc.) by August 2023.

Award: Up to 90% tuition grant depending on financial need; renewable for four years.

Jean "Gianni" van Daalen Scholarship

Who: Students applying for BA admission who demonstrate an exceptional record of academic and extracurricular achievement.

Award: Up to 5,000 EUR; financial need-based award.

AT A GLANCE

Degree Program

Bard College Berlin's interdisciplinary core curriculum explores intellectual history from ancient Greece to the present day. A critical focus is placed on philosophy, economics, politics, literature, art history, film, and the performing and studio arts. Currently, five majors are offered in Economics, Politics, Art and Aesthetics, Ethics and Politics, and Literature and Rhetoric.

German and U.S. Accreditation

Bard College Berlin is accredited in the United States through Bard College by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education. In Germany, Bard College Berlin is institutionally accredited at national level by the Wissenschaftsrat (the German Council of Science and Humanities).

Degrees Granted

Bachelor of Arts degrees are awarded by both Bard College Berlin and Bard College in Annandale-on-Hudson, New York.

Location in Berlin

Bard College Berlin's residential campus is located in the neighborhood of Pankow, a borough in northeastern Berlin. Direct public transport connections allow students to reach the city center in 30-40 minutes.

On-Campus Accommodation

Students are expected to live on campus in furnished apartments during their first and second years of study, and may choose to live off campus in their last two years at BCB. All on-campus housing is fully-equipped, including kitchens.

ADMISSION

Bard College Berlin does not charge an application fee. Applicants for all programs should apply online by filling out the online application form available on our website.

Bard College Berlin is a member of the Common Application. Required materials include: motivation statement, writing sample, two letters of recommendation, official transcripts, and proof of advanced English proficiency for non-native English speakers. SAT/ACT scores are not required.

FINANCIAL AID AND FEES

All BA and Academy Year applicants are eligible to apply for need-based financial aid and scholarships, regardless of nationality. U.S. citizens may use U.S. federal funding (FAFSA) for their BA studies at Bard College Berlin. Bard College Berlin is recognized by many European countries for government loan programs.
