Course Description

The purpose of this seminar is to prepare OLIve-UP students for making their applications to CEU MA programs. The goal of the course is to familiarise students with the requirements of CEU MA applications and to assist students in making competitive applications.

Requirements

Attendance is mandatory. Before the first session, students should identify MA programs at CEU that they may wish to apply to and their entry requirements. These can change over the course of the program, in the first step please identify everything that you are interested in.

Academic Integrity

Writing assignments will vary. If you are applying for a program that requires a longer essay or research proposal as part of the application, you will be expected to produce a draft of this by the end of the seminar. All students will draft a motivation letter/statement of purpose and CV.

0	31 August - 7 September	Before the first session, students should identify MA programs at CEU or elsewhere that they may wish to apply to and their entry requirements. These can change over the course of the program, in the first step please identify everything that you are interested in.
1	8 September	Introduction to MA applications at CEU
		What makes a good MA application? In this seminar we will review key points that graduate programs look for when assessing applications. Students will receive a general introduction to MA studies at CEU and of the requirements of each degree program that they are interested in studying and an overview of the CEU online applications system.
		Do you have all the documents needed to make an application? Typically, these are copies of degrees and transcripts from previous study. Will you have difficulties getting academic references in English? What are the standardised exams that you will need to take? (TOEFL, GRE/GMAT).

		TASK: Prepare an application plan with deadlines, required documents, check and confirm 'technical' items required - translation of degrees, transcripts, TOEFL and other standardised exam and all other documents. Prepare any questions that you want clarified. (deadline: Monday, 14 September)
2	15 September	What is a good statement of purpose and an academic CV?
		In this session we will analyse samples of SoPs and CVs to understand what makes for a good statement of purpose and an academic CV.
		TASK 1: Use the Worksheet 1 to answer the questions about your motivation to study at CEU/in a particular program (deadline: Monday, 21 September)
		TASK 2: Prepare your academic CV (deadline: Monday, 21 September)

		What do CEU Departments look for in a motivation letter or statement of purpose? How should you present yourself succinctly as a candidate the Department should be interested in?
		TASK: Draft your Statement of Purpose based on the Worksheet 1 and seminar discussions so far. The draft should be between 300 and 400 words. (deadline: Wednesday. 7 October)
4	October 12-14	Individual Consultation with instructor
		TASK 1: Submit a revised version of your motivation letter by November 4, end of the day
		TASK 2: Submit a revised version of your CV by November 4, end of the day
5	November 10	Second drafts of statements of purpose/letters of motivation are reviewed during this class by the instructor and one peer reviewer based on the provided criteria. By this time you should confirm which MA programs you are going to apply to.

		TASK 1: Give peer feedback following the guidelines received by the instructor
		At home:
		TASK 2: Incorporate peer and instructor feedback. IMPORTANT: It is your responsibility to work on it and submit an improved version by December 28 the latest.
		TASK 3: Before the next session (23 November, end of the day), identify questions that you would like to ask representatives of CEU Departments. Write the questions <u>here</u> .
		TASK for those who have an essay to write for the application: a draft idea should be submitted by Friday, 20 November. This can be connected to any other writing assignment in the Program: you are not expected to write a separate paper for this purpose – but you need to ensure that it fits the requirements of the program

		you are applying to. The writing sample should be consulted with the tutor, English Composition instructor, as well as with the Academic Writing instructor.			
6	24 November	Sample of writing and questions for CEU departments We will first go through the questions for CEU departments. For applications that require an essay we will check in to see the progress and discuss any difficulties.
