Course Description

In this course, students will study and practice the art of English composition by preparing and composing five different types of essays. Students will work with various coursebook materials, authentic materials, and one another to generate ideas and deepen their understanding of various essay structures, writing strategies and purposes.

Where an instructor agrees to accept a late essay, it must be submitted within four weeks of the deadline and cannot receive a grade of higher than C. Thereafter, the student will receive a failing grade for the assignment.
