



## JEAN SIBELIUS

# VIOLIN CONCERTO

Born 12/8/1865 in Tavastehus (Hämeenlinna), Finland Died 9/20/1957 at age 91 in Järvenpää, Finland

Allegro moderato (moderately fast) 16 min Adagio di molto (very slow) 9 min Allegro ma non troppo (fast, but not too fast) 8 min

#### XINRAN LI'20 violin

Written 1902-04, revised 1905, in Sibelius' late 30s Premiered 2/8/1904 in Helsinki by the Helsingfors Philharmonic, Sibelius conductor, Victor Nováček violin



- Sibelius had once hoped to become an accomplished violinist himself.
- This masterpiece is the only concerto he ever wrote.

Born 9/25/1906 in St. Petersburg Died 8/9/1975 at age 68 in Moscow

# **SYMPHONY** NO. 10

Moderato (at a moderate pace) 23 min Allegro (fast) 4 min Allegretto (moderately fast) 12 min Andante-Allegro (moderately slow, then fast) 13 min

Written 1953, at age 47 Premiered 12/17/1953 in Leningrad (now St. Petersburg) by the Leningrad Philharmonic, Yevgeny Mravinsky conductor



- The is the first symphony Shostakovich wrote after the death of Stalin.
- Many believe this piece reflects the often stormy relationship between Stalin and Shostakovich.
