



**DEVELOPING TEACHING PROFESSIONALS
CALL FOR APPLICATIONS
OSUN TEACHING MENTORSHIP PROGRAM**

Deadline: August 30, 2023

The Open Society University Network's (OSUN) **Developing Teaching Professionals Program** hosted by CEU's Yehuda Elkana Center for Teaching, Learning, and Higher Education Research, invites applications to the OSUN Teaching Mentorship Program. The program provides support to faculty and those with teaching positions at OSUN institutions. Mentoring sessions are led by Yehuda Elkana Center faculty developers and staff and will take place during the mentee's period of instruction. Sessions address the professional needs of the mentee as well as course-specific topics. These might include syllabus design, session planning, assessment, and broad issues related to teaching and learning. Mentoring is part of a structured development program fostering reflective teaching practice and professional growth. The mentorship period is a semester long commitment. Mentorship can, by mutual consent between mentor and mentee, be extended for a second term.

Eligibility

Faculty and doctoral students with teaching responsibilities at [OSUN-member institutions](#) are eligible to apply. Eligibility is not restricted to those with full-time or long-term appointments, and early-career academics (including doctoral students teaching a course/module, postdocs, and non-permanent instructors) are encouraged to apply. Courses must be scheduled to be taught during the 2023-2024 calendar year.

Promotion of Early-Career Academics

Preference will be given to early-career academics (doctoral student or an early-career academic up to six years after the completion of the doctorate) and those new in their teaching positions. The committee will take the potential impact and benefit of mentoring on teaching as well as the balance and diversity of the mentee cohort into consideration during the selection process.

Application Process and Deadline

The application consists of a [short form](#), CV, and syllabus. Applicants should complete the form and email their CV and one or more syllabi they will teach this year to dtp@ceu.edu. Informal enquiries are also welcome at the same email address.
