

Community Action Awards

Each summer, approximately 40 students across the Open Society University Network and the Bard International Network apply for and receive Community Action Awards (CAA). Community Action Awards aim to support student efforts to engage with communities locally, nationally, and internationally by providing funding for participation in unpaid or underpaid internships that address different issues impacting people around the world.

Engaged Senior Project

Application and Deadlines: April (Spring Semester), October (Fall Semester)

Engaged Senior Projects are student research projects that fulfill a requirement on campuses that require a senior or capstone project. Student microgrants are available to support student research that is centered on a question that emerges from a community engagement activity or experience, or that is conducted in collaboration with a community partner.

Certificate in Civic Engagement


Application and Deadline: Fall and Spring Semesters

Community Innovation Hubs - Institutional Community Engagement Grants

OSUN is offering institutional grants through the Bard Center for Civic Engagement to build the capacity of studentled start-up initiatives that have the potential to become long-term institutional program initiatives focused on addressing an identified community need. Initiatives can include student-driven community partnerships, social innovation incubator projects, or student-led big ideas that demonstrate promise for long-term impact. Grants are for \$15,000 USD for a one-year period. Initiatives for consideration should be led by students preparing to graduate in 2021. Learn more <u>HERE</u>.
